Shellfish Dive Catch: Code of Conduct




If you collect seafood whilst diving, please respect our code of conduct and help towards maintaining a rich and sustainable marine community in the **Purbeck Marine Wildlife Reserve** and surrounding seas.

Support Sustainability

- L Limit Limit your catch. Act responsibly by only taking enough for one meal, not enough to fill your freezer
- **O Others** Be *mindful* of others. If you see pots, buoys or fishermen do not disturb them.
- **B Be Careful** Avoid harming delicate plants and animals when you are diving or anchoring.
- **S** Size Size does matter. Are you aware of the legal minimum catch sizes (see overleaf)? Please only take animals well above the legal size limit.
- **T** Trade Did you know it is *illegal* to sell your catch unless you hold a commercial fishing licence?
- **E Eggs** It is illegal to take lobsters if they are carrying eggs or if they have a "V" notch in their tail; it is sensible to leave all breeding animals alone. Larger individuals produce more offspring, so leave any really big shellfish that you see.
- **R Return** *Please* do not just throw unwanted catch overboard. *Help us protect* shellfish by carefully returning them to where they were found.


All lines to scale
